M.A.C./483 dated 14.08.2024 received for seeking permission for increase in intake capacity from 60 seats to 100 seats in existing UG (BAMS) course and vide ref. no. M.A.C./525 dated 31.08.2024 & 679 dated 25.10.2024 received to start 07 new PG Courses with 35 seats in the subjects namely (i) Panchkarma- 05 seats (ii) Shalaky Tantra-05 seats (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (v) Rachna Sharir-05 seats (vi) Kriya Sharir-05 seats and (vii) Agad Tantra- 05 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

1. I am to refer to your application/scheme vide **ref. No. M.A.C./483 dated 14.08.2024 and vide ref. no. M.A.C./525 dated 31.08.2024 & 679 dated 25.10.2024 received**, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely **Shri Baba Mastnath Ayurvedic College, VPO. Asthal Bohar, Distt. Rohtak-124021, Haryana (Inst. ID:- AYU0036) your college was visited on 05.05.2025 & 06.05.2025 for issuance of LOI** and accordingly Letter of Intent (LOI) was issued to your college vide letter of **even no. dated 10.06.2025 for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats and to Start 07 new PG Courses with 35 seats in the subjects namely (i) Panchkarma- 05 seats (ii) Shalaky Tantra-05 seats (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (v) Rachna Sharir-05 seats (vi) Kriya Sharir-05 seats and (vii) Agad Tantra- 05 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2025-26.**
2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) again carried out an inspection of the institution **on 07.08.2025 and 08.08.2025 through Hybrid mode**. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
3. Thereafter, the assessment report and all other related documents were placed in the **141st Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **14.08.2025 and Board decided to issue Letter of Permission (LoP) for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats and to Start 07 new PG Courses with 35 seats in the subjects namely (i) Panchkarma- 05 seats (ii) Shalaky Tantra-05 seats (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (v) Rachna Sharir-05 seats (vi) Kriya Sharir-05 seats and (vii) Agad Tantra- 05 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26.**
4. Further, in accordance of the regulation **59 (6)** of notified Regulations namely the "**Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Institutions Regulations, 2024** and in accordance of the regulation **43 (2) (a)** of notified Regulations namely the "**Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Post Graduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024** a letter was issued to you vide letter of even no. dated **25.08.2025** to furnish fixed security deposit worth **Rupees 01 Crore for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course** for a period of five year and **Rupees 3.50 crore** to start 07 new PG Courses for a period of three year in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine. In response of the same you have furnished the fixed security deposit amount worth **Rupees 01 Crores** for a period of five years through online payment mode vide **UTR no. CNRBR52025091165276854 dated 11.09.2025** and **Rupees 3.50 crore** for a period of three years through online payment mode vide **UTR no.**

"DECISION

5. Therefore, **Letter of Permission (LoP)** is issued to **Shri Baba Mastnath Ayurvedic College, VPO. Asthal Bohar, Distt. Rohtak-124021, Haryana (Inst. ID:- AYU0036)** for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and to Start 07 new PG Courses with 35 seats in the subjects namely (i) Panchkarma- 05 seats (ii) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (v) Rachna Sharir-05 seats (vi) Kriya Sharir-05 seats and (vii) Agad Tantra- 05 seats in accordance of regulation 43 (4) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 from the academic session 2025-26, under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming and following requirements shall be fulfilled: -
- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats and 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 07 new PG courses with 35 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counselling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
8. **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
9. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2025 and compliance report should be submitted to MARBISM in order to be considered for the process of the permission for the academic session 2026-2027 as per rules:**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- ii) All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
11. This permission to **increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats from the academic session 2025-26** as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2025-26 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCIS Act 2020.
12. This permission to **start 07 new PG Courses with 35 seats in the subjects namely (i) Panchkarma-05 seats (ii) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (v) Rachna Sharir-05 seats (vi) Kriya Sharir-05 seats and (vii) Agad Tantra-**

05 seats from the academic session 2025-26 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2025-26 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.

13. The fulfillment of the condition given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission matter for the academic session 2026-27
